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Dumbria io Coota da Morte

Dumbría is located in The Way from Santiago to Fisterra and Muxía. It is about 70km from Santiago, is framed in the Costa da Morte destination and belongs to the province of A Coruña.

There are seven parishes that form the Dumbría's Council: Santiago de Berdeogas, San Pedro de Buxantes, Santa Baia de Dumbría, Santa Uxía de O Ézaro, San Martiño de Olveira, Santiago de Olveiroa and San Mamede de Salgueiros.

The Castro and Xallas-Ézaro Rivers are the ones which mark the character of this municipality. It is a perfect mix of coastal and inland ingredients, which define the Dumbría's Council, whose area take up 125 square kilometres.





A perfect landscape is fruit of that combination of sweet and salty, land and sea, mountain and beach... This singularity allows that this unusual botanic specie, the "Downy Oak", is located only in this region of Galicia.

This wealth of rivers, valleys, mountains and sea are the ones which offer a great variety of flora and fauna; being a part of LIC Carnota-Monte Pindo, which is in Red Natura 2000 and declared as ZEPVN (Area of Special Protection of the Natural

Your memories will be unforgettable after visiting this region and after living a sunset from the **Ézaro Viewpoint** or from the Monte Pindo. Moreover, in the Interpretation Centre about Routes (CIR) of the Pindo Mountain and the Ézaro Waterfall you will find out more about this Celtic Olympus.

The water is part of the DNA of this area, its spectacular waterfall **Fervenza do Ézaro** surprise everyone that visit it. It is a magical place pervaded of legends. A river whose final cannot be more astonishing... A waterfall with more than 40m that is merged later into the sea. It is a present of the nature to enjoy along the day and at the nights of Holly Week and summer, accompanied by music and lighting.

The granite defines our character. The whimsical character of the nature is demonstrated when it creates sculptures with the rocks, sculptures that challenge the wind while they stay in perfect balance, such as the Pedra do Brazal.

The **Berdeogas Oakwood** is the place where live mythological beings; a natural place where you can enjoy the calm. Maybe, you will find here some goblin..

the way

It is said that in Fisterra was the **Ara Solis,** an altar of sun worship built by the habitants of this region before the arrival of the Romans. The pilgrims enter in Dumbría's region going across the bridge of A Ponte Olveira (17th -18th Centuries); a scenery of Napoleonic battles. They continue in direction to the Olveiroa village, whose medieval planning can be seen in its streets and buildings.

It is a really refuge of peace where the pilgrim will be able to get one's strength back to deal with a new journey of the way after having rest in the **hostel of pilgrims**.

A new stage of the way will go across the Vákner Territory; the dwelling place of the monster who was devouring pilgrims. This stage starts in Olveiroa to go up to the Sino Mountain in direction to **O Logoso;** which is a small village close to its Neolithic Fortified Settlement. The pilgrim continues to **Hospital**, which name is related to the existence of an old hospital for pilgrims in this place and that was destroyed by Napoleonic troops. Nowadays, it has an **Information Office for Pilgrims** in order to help them in their ways. Here the way forks and the pilgrim will have to decide where he wants to go: Fisterra or Muxía.

If he choose going in direction to Fisterra, he will find the **Pedra** Ancha petroglyph, the Marco do Couto transept, the Virxe das **Neves Sanctuary** and who knows if he will find the **Vákner?**

But if he decide going to Muxía, he will find wonderful places to discover and he will charge the batteries for a new journey in the modern facilities of the pilgrim hostel. Maybe the Vákner is walking around here these days...
